RE: Request for Permission to File a Lawsuit Against Attorney General Doug Moylan

Dear Chief Judge Tydingco-Gatewood,

I respectfully write to seek the Court's permission to file a lawsuit against Guam Attorney General Doug Moylan on behalf of myself and the homeless population of Guam. My complaint alleges dereliction of duty and misuse of public funding under his administration, particularly in matters related to addressing homelessness.

The Attorney General's actions—or lack thereof—have exacerbated the homelessness crisis by allocating significant public funds to temporary and ineffective measures, such as short-term hotel accommodations, while failing to consider sustainable and cost-efficient solutions like constructing tiny homes. This not only misuses taxpayer dollars but also neglects the fundamental rights of vulnerable individuals in our community.

As a concerned resident and advocate for Guam's homeless population, I believe these actions amount to a breach of fiduciary responsibility and a violation of constitutional protections. I intend to argue that Attorney General Moylan's policies:

1. Violate the Eighth Amendment's prohibition against cruel and unusual punishment by criminalizing poverty and homelessness.
2. Contravene the Equal Protection and Due Process Clauses of the Fourteenth Amendment by disproportionately targeting homeless individuals without addressing systemic causes.
3. Constitute a misuse of public funds in ways that fail to produce meaningful, long-term solutions.

I understand the weight of filing such a lawsuit against a public official and the importance of judicial oversight in ensuring it proceeds responsibly and within the bounds of the law. Therefore, I am seeking the Court's guidance and permission to move forward with this case, which I hope will bring justice and equitable solutions to the issues facing our community.

Enclosed, I have included a draft complaint outlining the specific claims and requested relief for your review. I am prepared to appear in Court to provide further clarification or documentation if necessary.

Thank you for your time and consideration of this matter. I am hopeful that the Court will see the merit in addressing these pressing concerns and allow this case to proceed.
